Srijan Adolescents Sprouting Their Roots

The Srijan Adolescent Training Programme is a joint initiative of the Madhya Pradesh Police and civil society partners, including Uday Society, aimed at nurturing positive behaviour, self-confidence, leadership, and life skills among adolescents—particularly girls from vulnerable socio-economic backgrounds. Under this initiative, up to December 2025, Uday Society has successfully conducted 11 Srijan programmes across Bhopal, Khandwa, and Jhabua districts, engaging 1261 adolescents in a structured and transformative learning process. Between July and December 2025, two Srijans (in Kamla Nagar, Bhopal and Police Lines, Jhabua) were conducted. The programme has led to visible outcomes, including improved self-discipline, goal-oriented thinking, enhanced self-awareness, skill development, and, most importantly, a stronger sense of social responsibility among participants.

To review, showcase, and build upon these positive changes, the Community Police Wing, Bhopal, organised an event titled Sneh Sammelan, which brought together police officials, civil society organisations from 35 districts, and Srijan-trained adolescents. The event featured case study presentations by four adolescents, sharing their personal journeys of transformation, while 20 adolescents delivered powerful demonstrations of a power walk and self-defence training—conveying messages of empowerment, resilience, and purpose-driven living. The programme was graced by DIG MP Police Community Police Wing Dr. Vineet Kapoor, along with Ms. Mary and Mr. Andrew from Youth for Human Rights International (YHRI), USA.

Shaurya: Advancing Girl Child Safety & Empowerment in MP



A two-day State-Level Consultation of the Juvenile Justice Committee of The High Court of Madhya Pradesh, titled “Shaurya – Girl Child Safety: Towards a Secure and Empowering Environment,” was held on August 30–31, 2025, at the MP State Judicial Academy, Jabalpur. The consultation brought together judges, government officials, police, academics, civil society organizations, adolescents, and young changemakers to strengthen collective action for the safety, dignity, and empowerment of girls.

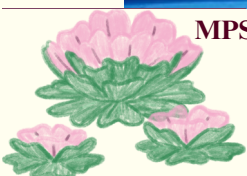
The program was inaugurated by Hon’ble Chief Justice Madhya Pradesh High Court Sanjeev Sachdeva, who emphasised that girls’ safety reflects the moral progress of society. Expert sessions addressed critical issues including child marriage and trafficking, cyber safety, adolescent health, effective communication, and gender-sensitive child protection. The “Agrini” Gender Module on Child Protection, in collaboration with UNICEF, was launched, celebrating youth-led leadership and stories of resilience.

A key highlight was the “Ground Realities” session, where members of Shaurya Dal, police officials, and young changemakers shared real-life experiences of interventions and challenges faced by girls. Adolescents from UNICEF Safe City Initiative partner organisations, including Uday Society, delivered powerful transformative stories on gender-based violence and women’s leadership, earning appreciation from the judiciary and dignitaries.

Also focused were inter-departmental reflections on progress and gaps between 2020–2025, with emphasis on strengthening schemes such as “Shaurya Didi” and “Beti Bachao Beti Padhao.” Adolescents presented on-ground challenges, ranging from school dropouts and unsafe public spaces to digital exclusion, and shared practical recommendations for policy action. The consultation concluded with a reaffirmed commitment from the judiciary and administration to imbibe the adolescents’ voices in policymaking and hence create safer and gender-equal cities and societies.

Nyay Sangoshti 2025: Advancing Legal Awareness Through Community Action



Uday Social Development Society, in convergence with the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) Bhopal, organised ‘Nyay Sangoshti 2025’, a legal awareness programme, on 10 September 2025 at Barkatullah University, Bhopal. The event aimed to promote legal awareness and strengthen community access to justice, particularly for women and vulnerable groups.

The programme was attended by over 600 participants, including Nyay Chaupal women leaders, men, children, law students, NSS volunteers, and adolescents from the Srijan program. Chief guests included Mr. Suneet Agrawal, Judge and Secretary, DLSA; Dr. Vineet Kapoor, DIG, Community Police Wing, MP Police; Mr. B. M. Singh, District Legal Officer; and Ms. Mona Purohit, Dean, Legal Department, Barkatullah University.

Dr. Lizy Thomas, Director of Uday Society, introduced Nyay Chaupal—a community-based legal aid initiative led by domestic violence survivor women. She shared that since June 2017, the initiative has supported the resolution of over 2,400 cases through counselling, follow-up, and referrals to relevant authorities, while promoting gender-sensitive families and communities.

The programme featured a mime performance by Srijan adolescents highlighting issues of gender inequality and violence. Sessions also focused on the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987, and procedures for accessing free legal aid, explained thoroughly by Judge Agrawal. Survivor testimonies showcased the transformative impact of Nyay Chaupal, illustrating how empowered women are now supporting others in similar situations.

The event concluded with a tree plantation activity at the university campus, organized in collaboration with the Forestry Department, symbolizing collective responsibility towards community well-being, and sustainability.

Training on Responsible Masculinity - Family Strengthening Program



A training on Responsible Masculinity in Bhopal was organized by Uday Society, marking a significant step towards engaging men in conversations on gender responsibility and non-violence. The event was graced by Mr. Suresh Tomar, Secretary, MP State Commission for Women, as chief guest and master trainer, along with Ms. Shweta Sharma, In-charge, Misrod Police Station's URJA Help Desk, and Uday management and team.

The programme saw the participation of 67 individuals, including 31 men from socially vulnerable backgrounds—an important outcome, as men from such contexts, or even in general, rarely come forward to acknowledge or reflect on their role in domestic violence or family conflict. Their willingness to attend and engage openly reflected a meaningful shift towards accountability and change. Also present were domestic violence survivors and adolescents.

The training focused on unpacking deeply rooted masculine norms and how they influence behaviour within families. Through interactive sessions and facilitated discussions, participants examined gender-based privileges, rigid expectations of masculinity, and the impact of violence – mental, physical, sexual, and economic – on women and families. Real-life reflections from male participants revealed growing awareness of shared domestic responsibilities and the harmful effects of alcohol and aggression on family well-being. The presence and engagement of men throughout the program reinforced Uday Society's belief that sustainable change burgeons more when men are actively involved as allies in building respectful, non-violent, and gender-sensitive families. Maintaining complete integrity with oneself and one's family was discussed as the bedrock of a just society.

The program concluded with festive greetings ahead of Deepawali, celebrating reflection, responsibility, and the first steps towards transformation.



Women's Anti-Violence Fortnightly Campaign Strengthens Awareness and Community Action



From 25 November to 10 December 2025, Uday Society conducted a series of awareness activities under the International Women's Anti-Violence Fortnightly Campaign, reaching 5,486 women, adolescents, youth, and community members across Bhopal, Khandwa, and Jhabua districts. The campaign focused on strengthening legal awareness, community engagement, and access to support systems for preventing violence against women and girls.

The campaign began with expert-led sessions facilitated by police and legal professionals, including Station House Officer at Women's Police Station Anjana Dubey, District Legal Officer B.M. Singh and District Legal Advocate Arvind Singh informing women about the Domestic Violence Act, 2005, gender equality, cyber-crimes, and reporting mechanisms. Constitution Day was observed through interactive activities in collaboration with government schools, promoting constitutional values and civic responsibility. Community advocacy efforts, including a power walk led by Nyay Chaupal members and adolescents during Bhojpal Mela Utsav 2025, amplified messages of safety and women's rights.

Psycho-social and mental health awareness sessions were conducted with students and teachers, introducing concepts of adolescent mental health, cyber safety, and Psychosocial First Aid (PFA). Participants were connected to essential support services, including Tele-MANAS, Child Helpline, and Cyber Helpline. A POSH (Prevention of Sexual Harassment) session was conducted for Uday's staff as well.

Overall, the campaign contributed to enhanced legal awareness, increased community-level dialogue on preventing violence, improved understanding of mental health support, and stronger linkages between communities, institutions, and service providers.

Muskaan Special Campaign



The Muskaan Special Campaign, implemented jointly by the Madhya Pradesh Police and civil society partners including Uday Society, is a focused awareness initiative aimed at the recovery of missing minor-aged girls, prevention of crimes against girls and adolescents, and strengthening their awareness on safety procedures within schools.

Under this campaign that spread across the state, outreach activities were conducted in 8 schools across Bhopal, Khandwa and Jhabua by Uday, with the support of 13 police stations, reaching more than 5800 individuals. The campaign emphasized the importance of immediate reporting to police authorities in case of any suspicion or untoward incident, a commitment collectively endorsed by students, teachers, and community members.

In response to the rising incidence of crimes against adolescent girls and other women, targeted sessions were conducted for students from grades 5 to 12. These sessions focused on child safety and protection, understanding safe and unsafe touch, procedures for reporting missing cases, awareness of digital and cyber-related crimes, and practical prevention strategies.

The successful implementation of the Muskaan Special Campaign was made possible through the active participation of district police officials, police personnel at the station level and the dedicated Uday team, making it a strong, impactful, and outcome-oriented initiative; a path toward awareness and women empowerment.

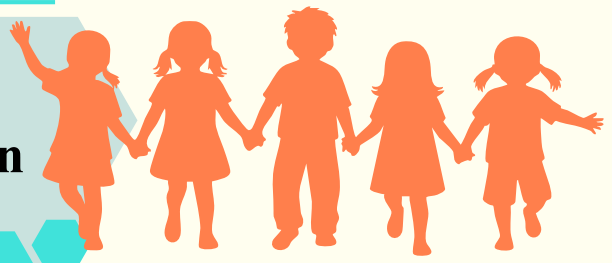

Children's Rights Awareness Week Strengthens Community Sensitisation



Children's Rights Awareness Week from 14 to 20 November 2025 was observed by Uday Society across 35 villages and 55 slums in Jhabua, Khandwa, and Bhopal districts, with the aim of strengthening awareness on children's rights and encouraging collective responsibility among families, communities, and institutions. The initiative focused on amplifying children's voices while promoting sensitivity towards child protection and well-being.

As part of the week, several programmes were held in the 3 districts, with the participation of police officials, legal services representatives, local governance leaders, and community members from 12 villages. Addl. SP Khandwa Mahendra Tarnekar and ACP Zone 2 Bhopal Rajnish Kashyap were among the chief guests. Children led the programme through street plays, poster exhibitions, creative activities, and martial arts demonstrations, addressing issues such as child marriage, education, gender discrimination, and excessive mobile phone use. Informative sessions covered safe and unsafe touch, cyber safety, substance abuse, and important helpline services for children and women.

Overall, the campaign reached 5,127 children, community members, public representatives, and officials. Additional activities, including competitions, sports events, educational visits, and awareness sessions across departments and colleges, further strengthened understanding of children's rights and responsibilities. The initiative reinforced Uday Society's continued commitment to building safer, more informed, and child-sensitive communities through collaboration and sustained engagement.

Staying Away from Substance Abuse Is Essential” – Awareness Campaign 2025



From 15 to 30 July 2025, the Madhya Pradesh Police, in collaboration with Uday Society and other civil society organisations, conducted a state-wide de-addiction awareness campaign titled “Staying Away from Substance Abuse Is Essential.” The campaign aimed to sensitise communities about the harmful effects of substance abuse and encourage youth to commit to a substance-free life.

The campaign was inaugurated at the Bhopal Police Commissionerate Office in the presence of Hon’ble MLA Shri Bhagwan Das Sabnani, senior police officials, civil society representatives, and students. Participants took a pledge against substance abuse, followed by an awareness rally to spread the message among the public.

Over the 15-day period, awareness sessions highlighted the growing dangers of alcohol, tobacco, and other narcotic substances, particularly among youth, and their impact on individuals, families, and society. Joint sessions organised by Uday Society and the Police Department in Khandwa, Jhabua, and Bhopal reached approximately 9,367 people.

The campaign reinforced the collective commitment towards building a drug-free and safer society, while also sharing emergency and mental health support helpline information to ensure timely assistance.

Nyayotsav Marathon 2025

Promotes Gender Equality and Responsible Masculinity

In collaboration with the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), a marathon was organized on November 09, 2025 at the District and Sessions Court, Bhopal. Held as part of DLSA's Nyayotsav program, the marathon aimed to raise awareness on gender equality and responsible masculinity. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from over 220 individuals, including women from Nyay Chaupal, adolescents, men, and law students.

The programme was graced by Principal District Judge Manoj Kumar Shrivastava, Judge and DLSA Secretary Suneet Agrawal, and District Legal Officer B. M. Singh, along with other esteemed members of the judiciary. Judge Shrivastava flagged off the marathon and later felicitated the top three finishers, with Uday Society's adolescents securing the first and second positions. The event also featured a short skit by Uday-supported students highlighting road safety and non-violence. Concluding the marathon, participants collectively reaffirmed their commitment to advancing gender equality and building a more just and inclusive society.

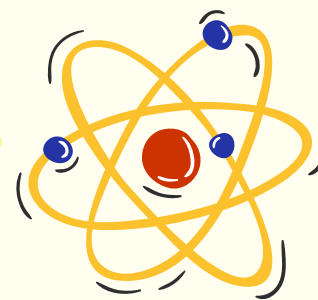

Nyay Chaupal Research Study Highlights Women's Empowerment and Community Leadership



A small-scale research study was conducted by Uday Social Development Society between August and December 2025 across various slums in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh, with all 195 Nyay Chaupal members. Nyay Chaupal is a community based legal-aid cell by domestic violence survivors (Of the survivors, For the survivors, By the survivors). Through a convergence model, it has been able to solve more than 2400 cases of domestic violence since its inception on June 28, 2017.

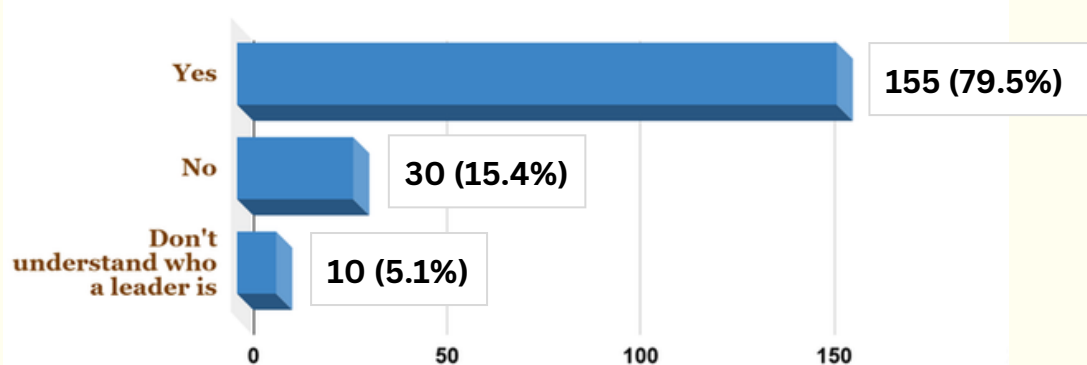
Aim: To assess how empowered NC members felt after Uday's intervention, their understanding of domestic violence, its types and gender equality, whether they intervened in any domestic violence cases themselves, and finally, compilation and management of data of their whereabouts for future follow-up.

Tool: The survey tool was a user-friendly questionnaire via the Google Forms application, with simply framed single and multiple-choice questions. The methodology was one-on-one detailed interview by Uday staff, who then filled the survey forms simultaneously.

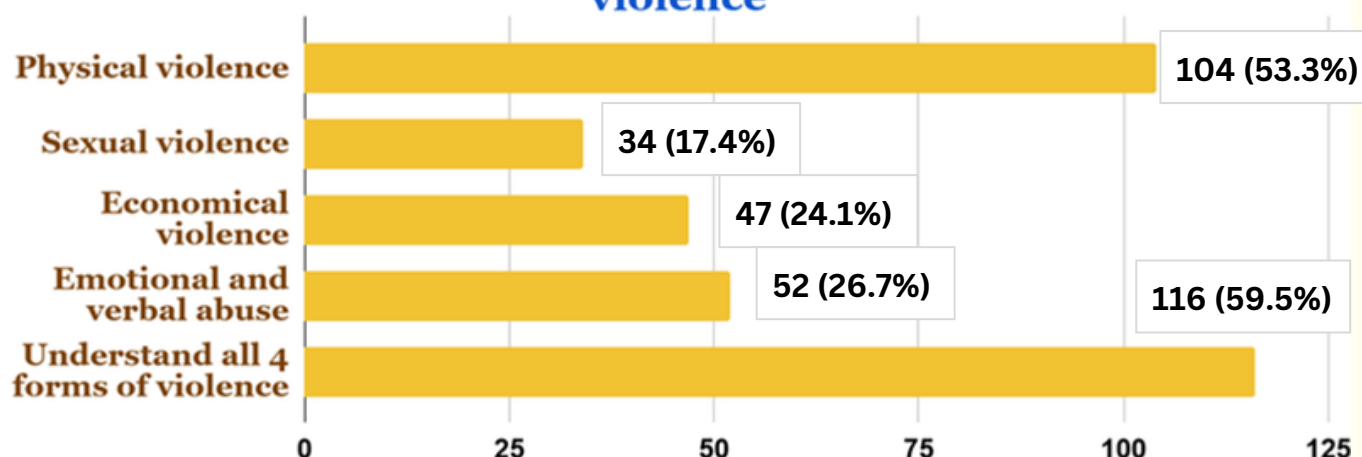
Population: In total, all 195 NC members were surveyed from 13 NC groups and 13 slums in Bhopal. The youngest participant was 21 years old while the eldest was 65; the average age was 39 years.

Presented below are some stats from the study on empowerment and leadership enhancement of Nyay Chaupal leaders, domestic violence cases engaged by them, gender equality at their homes and finally, their work as agents of change in the community.

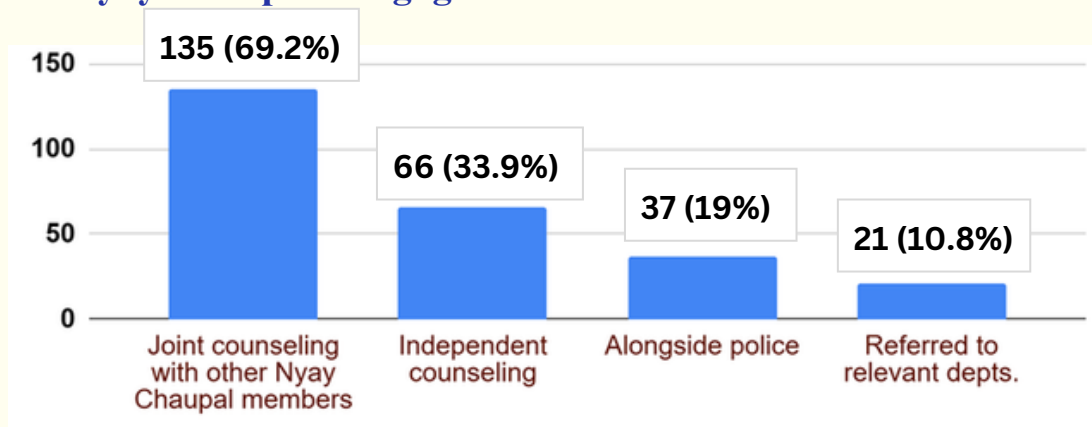
Nyay Chaupal women on themselves as leaders



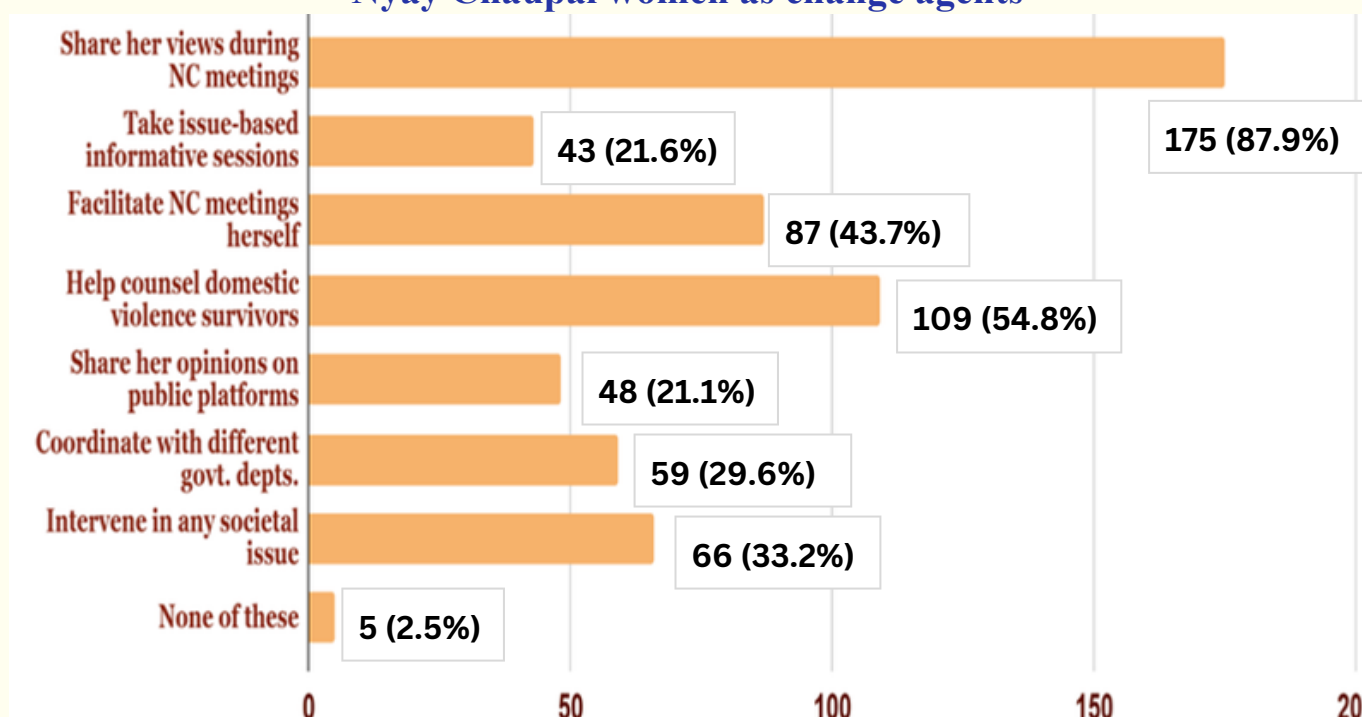
Women's understanding of different forms of domestic violence



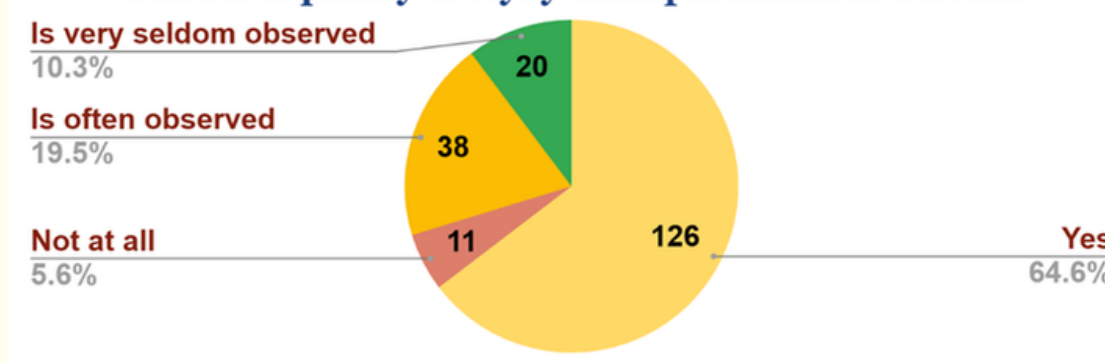
Nyay Chaupal's engagement with domestic violence cases

Uday Society saw active participation from interns representing various colleges, universities, and academic disciplines during the year, reflecting strong collaboration between academia and the development sector. Students from BSW, MSW, and BA-LLB programmes undertook internships ranging from one week to one month, contributing to the organisation's social initiatives.

An exposure session was planned at Uday Society Bhopal for 29 BSW and MSW students and staff from the Bhopal School of Social Sciences. The session introduced participants to the role of NGOs in community development and highlighted Uday Society's work across Bhopal, Khandwa, and Jhabua districts.

A Shakti Samiti meeting was organised at Piplani Chandbadi in coordination with the Piplani Police Station, attended by women, children, and law student interns from Barkatullah University. Discussions focused on human trafficking and child protection, covering topics such as missing children, positive parenting, legal age of marriage, and awareness of safe and unsafe touch.

Additionally, a session on Child Protection Policy was conducted by Mr. Rajeev Bhargava from Bachpan Organisation for Uday Society staff and law interns, emphasising the key pillars of child protection and policy-based interventions.

Overall, more than 70 students participated through internships, exposure visits, awareness sessions, and field-based learning. Uday Society continues to offer meaningful learning opportunities while promoting community service, child protection, and social development.

CELEBRATIONS AT UDAY

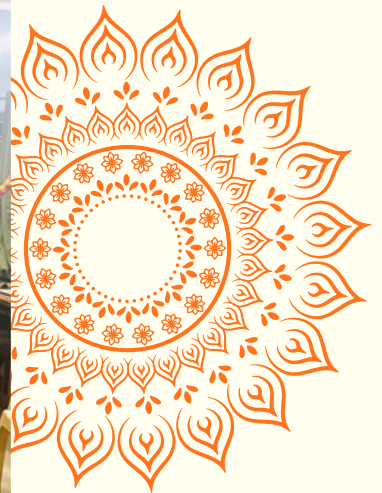

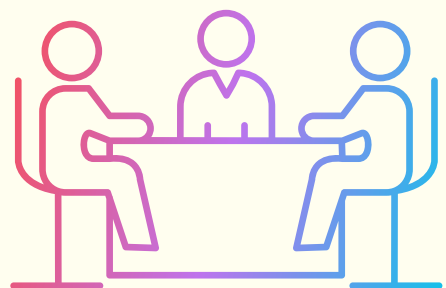

From laborer to leader: Tarun's Journey of Change

At 23, Tarun Ahirwar from Akbarpur Basti represents the transformative power of guidance and opportunity. Forced to discontinue his education after 12th grade due to financial hardship, Tarun began working as a daily wage labourer to support his family. Growing up in a community where child labour and school dropouts were common, his future seemed limited by circumstance.

Everything changed when he connected with Uday's team and joined youth platforms such as their youth wings and adolescent groups. Realizing that child labour is a bane and also illegal, through awareness activities, Tarun began speaking out against it, reaching over 200 families and highlighting its harmful impact on children's health, education, and mental well-being. Slowly, a sense of purpose took root in him.

His journey deepened through the Srijan Adolescent Empowerment Initiative by MP Police's Community Police Wing. Training on constitutional rights, gender equality, leadership, and self-defence strengthened his confidence and communication skills. More importantly, it reshaped his mindset: from survival to thriving!

Tarun went on to complete ComMutiny's The Youth Collective fellowship in 2025 Fellowship, conducting community awareness programmes on constitutional values and social change. He also supported residents in addressing issues such as substance abuse, gender discrimination, and access to education and documentation; he helped reconnect 3 girls with formal education. Uday supported and guided him throughout his journey.

As a Barefoot Counselor (an initiative by UNICEF India for building adolescents' capacity for MHPSS and informal counseling), Tarun helps adolescents navigate mental stress. Leading by example, he continuously shares household responsibilities at home, challenging traditional norms through action. Now enrolled in a Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) degree at Mahatma Gandhi Chitrakoot Gramodaya University, Tarun continues to move forward with clarity and determination.
